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MAKING STRIDES TOWARDS RECOVERY

SUMMARY

San Antonio International Airport (SAT)'s passenger numbers grew 271% to 756,118 when compared to the same month in 2020. An increase in vaccinations and access to the vaccine, schools closed for the summer, and pent-up demand for leisure travel resulted in over 700,000 passengers passing through SAT for the first time since the pandemic started.

When compared to the month prior, May 2021, passenger numbers grew 10%. This growth indicates continued recovery; however, it is important to compare these numbers to the same month in 2019. In June 2021, passenger numbers reached 80% of the levels seen during June 2019. San Antonio International Airport's strong growth towards recovery seen during the spring has continued into the summer as travelers continue to return to the skies.

Additionally, a total of 23,561,273 pounds of air cargo moved through SAT in June 2021, up 13% compared to June 2020 and in line with air cargo levels from the previous month. DOMESTIC PASSENGERS

SAT continues to compare passenger numbers to 2019 levels to better understand and monitor the recovery. Scheduled domestic capacity, or seats, were at 75%, or down 80,268 seats in June 2021 compared to the same month in 2019, with a total of 457,040 monthly departure seats. When compared to the prior month, May 2021, scheduled domestic capacity increased 8%, or an additional 32,527 seats.

Fueled by pent up demand, multiple routes from SAT saw increases in capacity when compared to June 2019. Service to Charlotte (CLT), Denver (DEN), Miami (MIA), Seattle (SEA), Tampa (TPA), Salt Lake City (SLC), Phoenix (PHX), Dallas (DFW), and Detroit (DTW) all had more capacity from SAT even if the number of flights were down compared to June 2019.

Many routes from SAT saw an increase in frequency and capacity from May 2021 to June 2021 as more people returned to traveling. In addition to this, airlines also resumed nonstop service to cities that were suspended due to the pandemic. June 2021 saw the resumption of service to Los Angeles (LAX), Kansas City (MCI), and San Diego (SAN) on Southwest (WN).

INTERNATIONAL PASSENGERS

After a complete halt in international travel from SAT in April 2020, international passengers slowly started returning in May 2020 and since then SAT has seen a quick recovery in international passenger numbers. One year later, SAT has had significant increases in both capacity and passenger numbers to and from Mexico. SAT's scheduled international capacity increased by 112% when comparing June 2021 to June 2019 while passenger numbers increased 77%.

Due to many factors including the closed land border, demand to and from Mexico from SAT has recovered and increased quickly. SAT ranked #1 among all U.S. medium-hub airports in terms of total seats to Mexico for June 2021. When looking at all U.S. airports, SAT ranked #9.

SAT saw many flights to Mexico increase both frequency and capacity in June 2021. This combined with new nonstop service launched in May to Leon/Guanajuato (BJX) and Cancun (CUN) resulted in more nonstop options and convenience for travelers and significant growth in international passenger numbers to and from San Antonio.

JUNE SCHEDULE CHANGES

American Airlines (AA) increased frequencies to Chicago-O'Hare (ORD) and increased capacity on service to Charlotte (CLT), Chicago-O'Hare (ORD), and Dallas-Ft. Worth (DFW).

Southwest (WN) added additional frequencies on service to Atlanta (ATL), Cancun (CUN), Houston-Hobby (HOU), and Orlando (MCO) and brought back nonstop service to Los Angeles (LAX), Kansas City (MCI), and San Diego (SAN).

VivaAerobus (VB) increased frequencies flying up to 5 daily flights to Monterrey (MTY).

UPCOMING CHANGES

Highly anticipated new carrier *JetBlue Airways (B6)* will start <u>new</u> nonstop service to New York (JFK) and Boston (BOS), a city that has long been the largest unserved market from San Antonio. Daily service BOS starts on October 31st and JFK on November 1st.

Southwest (WN) will launch <u>new</u> seasonal nonstop service to Colorado Springs (COS) as well as resume holiday nonstop service to Albuquerque (ABQ) on November 11th.

On September 2nd, Sun Country (SY) will join Allegiant (G4), Frontier (F9), and Southwest (WN) in offering nonstop service to Las Vegas (LAS).

Three airlines that offered nonstop service to the New York City area pre-pandemic will resume operations in the coming months. American Airlines (AA) service to New York (JFK) on August 17th, United Airlines (UA) to Newark (EWR) on September 8th, and Delta Air Lines (DL) to New York (JFK) on October 6th.

Nonstop service to San Francisco (SFO) will resume on United Airlines (UA) from September 9th giving SAT travelers more access to the Bay Area, West Coast, and beyond.

Nonstop service to New Orleans (MSY) on Southwest (WN) will resume on September 11th.
