#### MAKING STRIDES TOWARDS RECOVERY

#### SUMMARY

San Antonio International Airport (SAT)'s passenger numbers reached 668,347 in September 2021 representing a 141% increase in passengers when compared to the same month in 2020.

SAT saw impressive numbers of passengers return to the airport this summer fueled by pent up leisure travel demand due to increased vaccination availability and relaxed restrictions across the country. Historically, September is one of the slower months in terms of passenger traffic as the summer ends and children are back at school. Passenger numbers declined from August to September which was expected. Recovery did continue into September as was evident with the 141% increase in passengers compared to the same month in 2020 even with COVID-19 cases rising during this time due to the Delta variant.

As we monitor our recovery, we continue to compare our monthly numbers to the same month in 2019. In September 2021, passenger numbers reached 82% of the levels seen during September 2019.

Additionally, a total of 23,324,129 pounds of air cargo moved through SAT in September, up 8% compared to September 2019 and in line with air cargo levels from the previous month. #### **DOMESTIC PASSENGERS**

SAT continues to compare passenger numbers to 2019 levels to better understand and monitor the recovery. Total scheduled domestic capacity, or seats, were at 80% of what was flown in September 2019. Total seats from SAT in September totaled 803,130 a 3% decrease compared to August 2021. Domestic passengers in September reached 78% of 2019 levels.

This month, American Airlines (AA) continued to show their confidence in our market and flew 8% more capacity to SAT than they did in September 2019.

In September, Southwest (WN) increased both capacity and frequencies to key Texas markets including El Paso (ELP) and Dallas (DAL).

United Airlines (UA) brought back nonstop service to both Newark (EWR) and San Francisco (SFO) while Sun Country (SY) resumed their seasonal service to Las Vegas (LAS).

Delta Air Lines (DL)'s seat capacity for the month of September was 93% of what they operated in the same month in 2019 as a result of adding capacity to both Los Angeles (LAX) and Minneapolis (MSP).

#### INTERNATIONAL PASSENGERS

An impressive increase in both international capacity and passengers to and from SAT have helped our recovery. SAT's scheduled international capacity increased by 113% when comparing September to September 2019 while passenger numbers increased 73%.

Due to many factors including the closed land border, demand to and from Mexico from SAT has recovered and increased quickly. Pre-pandemic, nonstop service to Cancun (CUN) on Southwest (WN) would run seasonally from spring break through the summer. Due to increased demand this year, the airline extended their service to Cancun (CUN) which included offering the route in the month of September.

SAT ranked #1 among all U.S. medium-hub airports in terms of total seats to Mexico for September. When looking at all U.S. airports, SAT ranked #9 between Denver (DEN) and Phoenix (PHX).

In September, SAT offered more international seats than any other U.S. medium-hub airport. When comparing all U.S. airports in terms of total international seats offered, SAT ranked #21. Comparing this with the other large Texas airports, Houston (IAH) ranked at #6, Dallas (DFW) at #8, Houston (HOU) at #26, and Austin at #38 of the 66 U.S. airports that had international service in September 2021.

#### **September SCHEDULE CHANGES**

United Airlines (UA) resumed key routes from San Antonio to both Newark (EWR) and San Francisco (SFO).

Seasonal Sun Country (SY) service to Las Vegas (LAS) relaunched in September joining Allegiant (G4), Frontier (F9), and Southwest (WN) on the route.

#### **UPCOMING CHANGES**

Highly anticipated new carrier *JetBlue Airways (B6)* started <u>new</u> nonstop service to New York (JFK) and Boston (BOS), a city that has long been the largest unserved market from San Antonio. Service to BOS and JFK began on October 31<sup>st</sup>.

Southwest (WN) will launch <u>new</u> seasonal nonstop service to Colorado Springs (COS) as well as resume holiday nonstop service to Albuquerque (ABQ) on November 20<sup>th</sup>.

United Airlines (UA) will relaunch their nonstop service to Los Angeles (LAX) on February 11<sup>th</sup>. Those looking to go to this West Coast destination can fly on American Airlines (AA), Delta Air Lines (DL), and Southwest (WN) who all currently fly from SAT to LAX.

Delta Air Lines (DL) is scheduled to resume their service to New York (JFK) on March 7<sup>th</sup>. JetBlue Airways (B6) and United Airlines (UA) currently serve the New York metro.
