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AIRPORT MAKES STRIDES TOWARDS RECOVERY

SUMMARY

San Antonio International Airport (SAT) continued to welcome back travelers throughout 2021 as the airport and community continues to make strides towards recovery. A total of 7,464,662 passengers flew through SAT during the year, exceeding 2020 levels by 85%. Compared to prepandemic, SAT's total passenger counts reached 72% of levels seen during the record-breaking year of 2019. Compared to 2019, domestic traffic was down 32%, while international traffic increased a remarkable 59%.

2021 was not only a year of recovery with all airlines resuming service to markets that were temporarily suspended, but also a year of new service starting from the airport. In May, a new international destination was added when VivaAerobus (VB) launched nonstop service to Leon/Guanajuato (BJX). A couple weeks later, Sun Country (SY) started new, summerseasonal service to Cancun (CUN). San Antonio was one of the initial launch markets for the country's newest airline, Breeze Airways (MX). The airline currently connects SAT to Northwest Arkansas (XNA), a market that has never been served in the airport's history. On October 31st, the city welcomed its newest airline, JetBlue Airways (B6). The airline launched nonstop service to New York (JFK) and Boston (BOS), the latter being one of the country's largest unserved routes. Southwest Airlines (WN) also started new, holiday-seasonal service to Colorado Springs (COS).

In December 2021, the airport recorded 763,606 total passengers, a 112% increase compared to the same month in 2020 and 86% of the total passengers seen in 2019. Domestic traffic was down slightly at -16% while international traffic increased 27% compared to December 2019.

In regard to air cargo, 277,508,342 pounds moved through SAT in 2021, relatively flat compared to pre-pandemic but up nearly 5% compared to 2020 and approaching YTD levels not experienced since the pre-recession peak in 2008. For December, air cargo was up 2% compared to the year prior and up nearly 10% compared to December 2019.

DOMESTIC PASSENGERS

SAT continues to compare passenger numbers to 2019 levels to better understand and monitor the recovery. Total scheduled domestic capacity, or seats, were at 83% of what was flown in December 2019. Total domestic seats from SAT in December totaled 808,684 down 6% compared to November 2021.

In December 2021, Southwest (WN) offered both more frequencies and more seats on nonstop service to both New Orleans (MSY) and St. Louis (STL) compared to the month prior.

The following routes saw more capacity flown during December 2021 than December 2019:

- Allegiant (G4) to Las Vegas (LAS).
- American Airlines (AA) to Charlotte (CLT) and Miami (MIA).
- Delta Air Lines (DL) to Detroit (DTW), Los Angeles (LAX), and Salt Lake City (SLC).
- Frontier Airlines (F9) to Denver (DEN), Las Vegas (LAS), and Orlando (MCO).
- United Airlines (UA) to Denver (DEN) and Newark (EWR).

In 2021, SAT's domestic carriers resumed numerous routes that had been suspended due to the downturn in demand caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. Also, during 2021, SAT welcoming two new airlines to their portfolio of airlines with the addition of both Breeze Airways (MX) and JetBlue Airways (B6). Southwest (WN) also operated new, holiday-seasonal nonstop service to Colorado Springs (COS).

INTERNATIONAL PASSENGERS

International traffic grew by 27% in December on a 59% increase in scheduled capacity compared to pre-pandemic, with 89,788 total monthly seats. This was largely due to added capacity on several routes during December including to Guadalajara (GDL) on Volaris (Y4) and Mexico City (MEX) on Aeromexico (AM), VivaAerobus (VB), and Volaris (Y4).

For the year, international passenger numbers grew an incredible 59% compared to the record-breaking year of 2019. This growth is an impressive feat in the current environment. This growth not only helped SAT's recovery but further shows the growing ties between the region and Mexico.

SAT ranked #1 among all U.S. medium-hub airports in terms of total seats to Mexico for the year. When looking at all U.S. airports, SAT ranked #11 between San Francisco (SFO) and Seattle (SEA).

When comparing all U.S. airports in terms of total international seats offered, SAT ranked #21. Comparing this with the other large Texas airports, Houston (IAH) ranked #5, Dallas (DFW) at #6, Houston (HOU) #25, and Austin (AUS) at #35 of the 73 airports that had international service during 2021.

UPCOMING CHANGES

SAT's airline partners continue to adjust their schedules in response to many factors due to the ongoing pandemic. Adjustments to the summer 2022 schedule are expected, but current schedules do have service levels from SAT at or above the levels seen prepandemic. Many routes from SAT are currently scheduled well above what was operated in summer 2019.

Southwest Airlines (WN) will begin <u>new, nonstop</u> service to Oklahoma City (OKC) on April 25th. Service will begin at 4x weekly operating on Sundays, Mondays, Thursdays, and Fridays before increasing to 6x weekly in June.

Delta Air Lines (DL) is scheduled to resume nonstop service to New York (JFK) on May 5th. For those looking to fly to New York, nonstop service to the New York metro area is currently being offered by JetBlue Airways (B6) and United Airlines (UA).

Sun Country (SY) will resume seasonal service to both Minneapolis-St. Paul (MSP) on May 20th and Cancun (CUN) on May 27th. Service to Cancun which started last year at twice weekly will be increased to 4x weekly through the summer.

Starting in June, United Airlines (UA) will increase capacity on their popular San Francisco (SFO) route. Currently served on a regional E-175 with 76 seats, the daily flight will switch to an A319 with 126 seats adding 67% more seats daily to the Bay Area.

Previously operated around the holidays, Southwest Airlines (WN) will start <u>new</u> Saturday service to Albuquerque (ABQ) on June 11th operated through the summer. While service is less than daily, Southwest (WN) often tests the viability of new markets by offering a limited schedule. If initial performance is positive, additional frequency is likely.
