

## A CENTURY+ OF AVIATION




Stinson Municipal Airport (SSF) originated as the Stinson School of Flying, established on 500 acres of land leased from the city by the Stinson family. When the United States entered World War I, civilian flights were prohibited, and the Army took control of the airfield, using it as an extension of Kelly Field. After the war, in 1919, the airport was renamed Stinson Municipal Airport.

Stinson Municipal Airport is the second oldest continuously operating airport in the United States and serves as the designated General Aviation Reliever airport for San Antonio International Airport. Located six miles south of downtown San Antonio, it features two runways and a full-service fixed-base operator (FBO).



### SERVICES AT STINSON

In addition to a full-service FBO, Stinson offers 24-hour self-service fuel, major and minor aircraft repair facilities, aircraft sales, storage, charter services, flight catering, helicopter training, pilot and passenger lounges, transient tie-downs, and hangar facilities.



#### WINGS OVER STINSON

In 2019, a new air traffic control tower was constructed at Stinson. The design, titled "Wings Over Stinson," incorporates biplane wings along the sides of the tower to celebrate over 100 years of aviation history in the city.

#### STINSON COMMUNITY

The airport is located along the Mission Reach of the San Antonio River and is near the San Antonio Missions National Historical Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. In November 2019, the City of San Antonio celebrated the opening of the Stinson Hike and Bike Trail, which connects the airport directly to the surrounding area.
