January 2026 Statistics

SUMMARY

In January 2026, the San Antonio International Airport's passenger numbers reached 724,646. Passenger levels for the month were down 6% compared to January 2025 while overall commercial airline capacity for the airport was down 8%.

Several airlines flew more seats to San Antonio this month than the same month in 2025. The airlines with the largest increases in service year-over-year included Frontier Airlines (F9), Alaska Airlines (AS), Delta Air Lines (DL), and American Airlines (AA).

Several factors resulted in passenger numbers for the month being below 2025 levels. This includes continued economic uncertainty as well as rare winter weather that caused widespread delays and cancelations throughout the country.

Additionally, a total of 15,274,762 pounds of air cargo moved through SAT during the month of January 2026, a decrease of 22% compared to the same month in 2025.

UPCOMING CHANGES

- Starting in March, **Viva (VB)** will increase their popular nonstop service to **Queretaro (QRO)** from twice weekly to three times weekly. The route will now operate every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday.
- **American Airlines (AA)** will resume seasonal service to **Philadelphia (PHL)** on April 8th, two months earlier than in previous years. This service is scheduled to operate through October.
- **Air Canada (AC)** will launch new, nonstop service to **Toronto (YYZ)** starting on May 2nd. This new service will not only provide nonstop service to the important Canadian city but also provide more options onwards throughout Canada and Europe.
- New, nonstop service to **Raleigh-Durham (RDU)** on **Breeze Airways (MX)** will launch on May 7th operating every Thursday and Sunday.
- **Breeze Airways (MX)** will launch new, nonstop service to **Memphis (MEM)** on May 8th with continuing, no plane change service to *Raleigh-Durham (RDU)* operating every Monday and Friday.
- **Sun Country (SY)** will resume seasonal service to SAT on May 22nd with service to both **Cancun (CUN)** and **Minneapolis-St. Paul (MSP)** operating every Sunday, Monday, Thursday, and Friday through mid-August.
- **Southwest Airlines (WN)** seasonal service to **Cancun (CUN)** which operates at various frequencies throughout the year will increase to daily for the summer on June 4th through mid-August.
- New, nonstop service to **Queretaro (QRO)** will launch on June 2nd on **Volaris (Y4)** operating every Tuesday, Thursday, and Sunday year-round.
- **Breeze Airways (MX)** will launch new, nonstop service to **Pensacola (PNS)** on June 10th with continuing, no plane change service to *Tampa (TPA)* operating every Wednesday and Sunday.
- Summer seasonal service to **Albuquerque (ABQ)** on **Southwest Airlines (WN)** will resume on June 7th operating every Sunday through mid-August.





DOMESTIC PASSENGERS

For January 2026, total scheduled domestic capacity, or seats, were down year-over-year by 7%, total domestic passenger levels were down by 6%.

Several airlines flew more passengers during January 2026 than during the same month in 2025. These included Frontier Airlines (F9), Alaska Airlines (AS), and Delta Air Lines (DL).

The following domestic routes had more service this year than in January 2025:


- Alaska Airlines (AS) to Seattle (SEA)
- American Airlines (AA) to Charlotte (CLT), Chicago (ORD), Los Angeles (LAX), Miami (MIA), Phoenix (PHX), and Washington, D.C. (DCA) **new**
- Delta Air Lines (DL) to Atlanta (ATL), Boston (BOS), Minneapolis-St. Paul (MSP), and Salt Lake City (SLC)
- Frontier Airlines (F9) to Atlanta (ATL) **new**, Denver (DEN), Las Vegas (LAS), and Phoenix (PHX) **new**
- Southwest Airlines (WN) to Nashville (BNA), Las Vegas (LAS), Orlando (MCO), and Tampa (TPA)
- Spirit Airlines (NK) to Ft. Lauderdale (FLL), Orlando (MCO), and San Juan (SJU) **new**
- United Airlines (UA) to Chicago (ORD) and Denver (DEN)





Domestic Market Share


Passengers Carried **January 2025**




Passengers Carried **January 2026**



Total Scheduled Seats **January 2025**




Total Scheduled Seats **January 2026**




Passengers Carried **YTD 2025**




Passengers Carried **YTD 2026**

INTERNATIONAL PASSENGERS

For January 2026, total scheduled international capacity, or seats, were down 18% compared to 2025 levels while total international passenger levels were down compared to 2025 by 11%.

SAT ranked #2 among all U.S. medium-hub airports in terms of total seats to Mexico for January 2026, behind only Oakland (OAK). When looking at all U.S. airports, SAT ranked #18 between Orlando (MCO) and Charlotte (CLT). This had SAT outranking several major airline hubs when it comes to total scheduled seats to Mexico.

In terms of total international seats, SAT ranked #30 out of all 77 U.S. airports that had international service in January.

The following international routes had more service this year than in January 2025:

- Viva (VB) to Leon/Guanajuato (BJX), Mexico City (MEX), and Torreon (TRC)
- Volaris (Y4) to Guadalajara (GDL), Morelia (MLM) **new**, and San Luis Potosi (SLP) **new**






Passengers Carried **January 2025**




Passengers Carried **January 2026**



Total Scheduled Seats **January 2025**






Passengers Carried **YTD 2025**




Passengers Carried **YTD 2026**
